A MOMENT of SAFETY

April's "Moment of Safety "was on proper securing/disposal of finishing towels and rags.

Used rags and towels used to apply some of the oil based finishes we use can spontaneously heat or combust if not properly handled. If we ball them up and throw into a pile or open can, they can heat up as they dry, potentially creating spontaneous combustion; this can take up to 48 hours. To safely dry, lay out separately and flat on the edge of a can or on the floor, or hang them until dry. There are metal cans designed to contain oily rags. The price range starts at \$80.00 and goes up. You can also rinse them off or place in a can of water.











