Nomination of Officers

The bylaws adopted by the Central Connecticut Woodturners in February of 1994 require our chapter to hold a general election every other year to elect the four principle officers. Those officers are identified as the President, the Vice President, the Secretary and the Treasurer. The bylaws instruct the President to appoint such additional positions and committees, as she or he deems necessary to support the mission of CCW.

At their August meeting the Board of Directors ask me to develop a slate of potential officers for the election to be held at our regularly scheduled meeting on November 27, 2007. I developed the slate listed below after consultation with each candidate and it only represents my recommendations.  - Steve Bemont round bottom burl with painted interior, sand blasted ash bowl, elm mask that was sandblasted, microwaved and airbrushed.

 - Bob Friedrich natural edge maple bowl (knee area), crab apple vase, basswood saturn shaped bowl and large ambrosia maple hollow form.
 - Mike Murray maple vase, air brushed & pierced.

Elected Positions

• Presentation followed given by Beth Ireland on tools & jigs. With the use of rare earth magnets stuck on her lathe Beth is able have many of her tools right at her fingertips. Beth showed how to make a simple morse taper jig and by adding tenions, hollow depressions, drill bits or screws you can make a variety of jigs for very little cost. Beth made tools using extra long hex shaped $\frac{1}{4}$ " allen wrenches. Collet chuck using pipe fittings, a handmade steady rest and using a circle of MDF & the same size piece of self stick sand paper you can make a simple disk sander or grinding wheel.

Next meeting: Saturday October 20th meeting woodshops of Bolton Woodturning and Turning 70. Keith Tompkins will be doing a presentation on multi axis turning. Instant Gallery with prizes awarded.


