April Demo by Rick Meier Natural Edge Bowl

Rick gave an excellent demo. After watching his demo and applying Rick's turning methods. A novice woodturner could successfully turn a natural edge bowl.

Rick demonstrated :

How to properly mount a bowl blank to give the natural edge a balance

How to turn and finish the outside

How to remount the piece so that the inside could be turned

How to turn the inside while preserving the natural edge

How to remount the bowl again so that the bottom could be finished

MY BEST NEW TOOL by Scott Duncan

My best new tool is....wait for it....a microwave. Rather than waiting for green wood to dry naturally, I've been taking my rough turned and finish turned bowls to the microwave oven. The thicker bowls I zap for a few minutes at a time and check the moisture level and weight. When the bowl cools down, I weigh the bowl and compare it to the previous weight. When the bowl stops losing weight, the process is done. I shoot for 8% moisture content. Thin and finish turned bowls take only a few minutes to dry. I was told by artist/woodturner Binh Pho that the microwave process dries the bowls from the inside out, thus the absence of cracking.




PEPPERMILLS

Three CCW members were given kits to make peppermills at the February meeting. The rest of the other club members are anxiously awaiting to see the fine work of these turners at the May meeting.


