Now that we all have had practice with Zoom VTCs, this month's demo will be a Live Remote Demo "The Sensational Skew" presented by Jim Echter. Jim demoed last year at the AAW symposium in Raleigh. We will post his bio.

"I will take the mystery out of how to use the skew so it becomes the sensational tool in your arsenal. Utilizing a combination of images, large scale models and actual demonstrations, the use of the skew will be broken down into very understandable chunks of information. The program will overview skew profiles, edge profiles, sharpening procedures, basic cuts, advanced cuts, and learning exercises. Project ideas will be demonstrated that will help you build confidence with using this sensational tool. The attendees will learn how to effectively use the skew as well as the cause and prevention of the dreaded dig in and screw thread".

The date will be **Tuesday JUNE 30 at 1900 (7:00 pm)**.

We will email instructions and a link towards the end of next week, I hope everyone can participate.

Treasurer's report was read by Mark Fields.

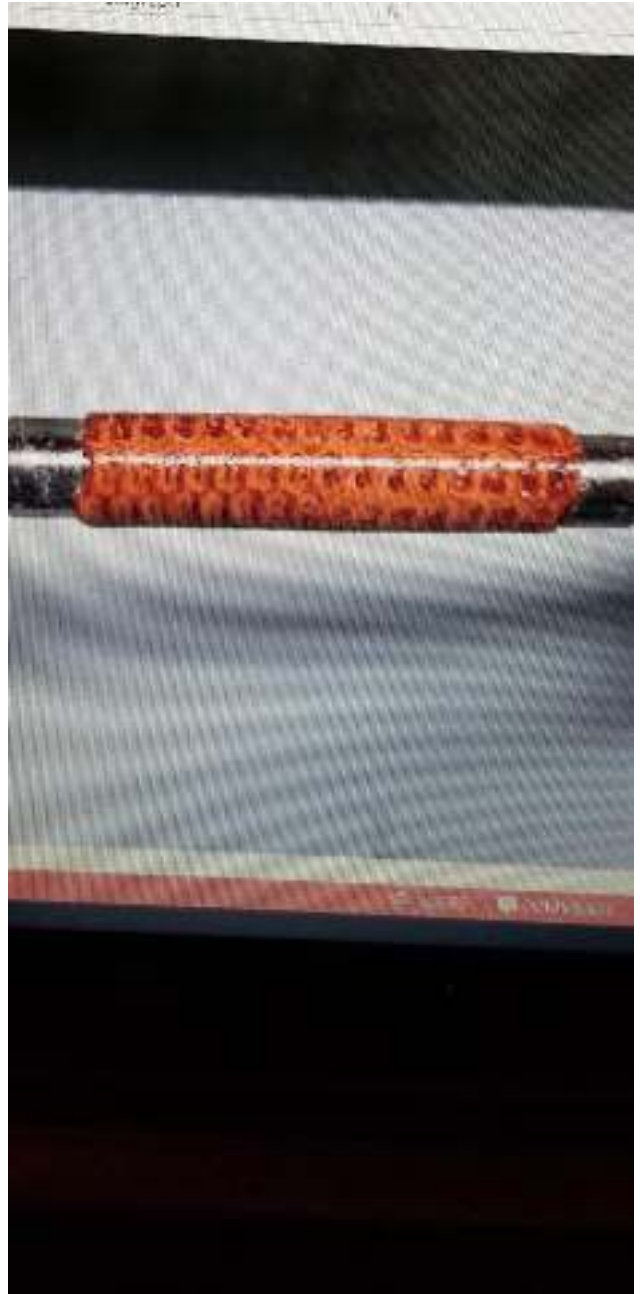
Note: Some members have still not paid their dues. If you don't know if you've paid this year, email Mark Fields, Treasurer at MarksWoodworks@JanFields.com.

Regarding live remote demos, John will contact remote demonstrators and find out the cost. Watch Facebook or newsletter for more info.

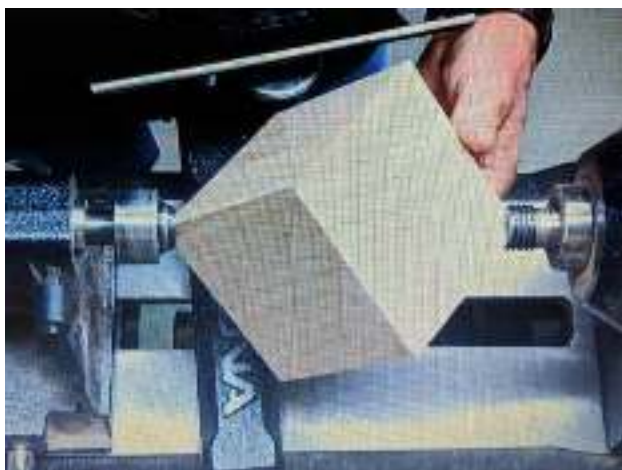

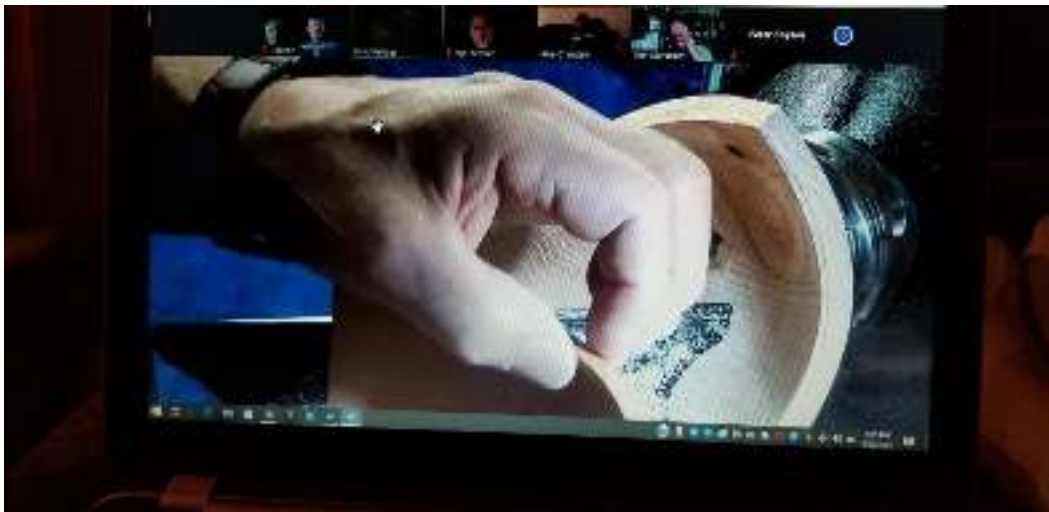
