DIRECTIONS TO BUTCH WATSON'S SHOP

36 Randall Rd, Lebanon, CT

Perhaps, the easiest way from the **Hartford** area would be to:

1. Take CT 2 East towards Norwich
2. Take exit 22
3. Turn left off the ramp
4. Drive to the STOP sign
5. Drive straight ahead across Norwich Road—You are now on WATERMAN ROAD
6. Drive on WATERMAN for approx 1.2 miles
7. Turn left on FOWLER DRIVE—This road is *unpaved*
8. Drive on FOWLER for approx 1.2 miles to a STOP sign. Notice that GOSHEN CHURCH IS ON THE RIGHT
9. At the Stop above, turn left on to Randall Road (*unpaved*)
10. Drive to the second home on the (The Watsons)

And perhaps, the easiest way from **Norwich and Points East** would be to:

1. Take CT 2 West towards Hartford
2. Take exit 22
3. Turn right off the ramp

Then follow steps 4 thru 10 above.

And of course, you may use a GPS or www.mapquest.com for other directions
